Mary Brinegar Receives Founders Award

The Women's Council of the Dallas Arboretum and Botanical Society announced Mary Brinegar as the 25th recipient of the Women's Council's Founders Award. Mary, whose career with the Arboretum began 25 years ago, is our Silver Anniversary recipient of this coveted award. Mary joined the Arboretum in 1996 as President and CEO. A graduate of SMU, she came to the Arboretum after nine years at KERA/Channel 13 and the nine vears before that with the Dallas Opera.

Over the years, she has won many awards for her accomplishments. Since joining the Arboretum she, together with the board and the Arboretum staff, has raised over \$100 million dollars for capital improvements including new buildings, gardens and the renovation of the DeGolyer and Camp homes on the property. The Arboretum currently has over 40,000 members and is expected to draw over a million guests this year alone.

Mary has been a loyal supporter of and cheerleader for the Women's Council since 1996 when she joined the Arboretum. She has also been an excellent role model and mentor to the leaders of the Women's Council and its members. Thanks to Mary and her incredible talents, the Arboretum is consistently ranked among the top public gardens in the country.
